



Information explosives precursors

According to the European Regulation on the Marketing and Use of Explosives Precursors (Regulation (EU) 2019/1148), suspicious transactions and the loss or theft of significant quantities of the substances listed in Annexes 1 and 2 (regardless of their concentration) must be reported to the state criminal police office or a police station within 24 hours.

This should significantly improve protection against attacks with homemade explosive devices

Currently (further substances possible), the following chemicals (precursors) are affected by this:

Acetone, aluminium powder, ammonium nitrate, hexamine, potassium chlorate, potassium nitrate, potassium perchlorate, calcium ammonium nitrate, calcium nitrate, sodium chlorate, sodium nitrate, sodium perchlorate, nitromethane, magnesium nitrate hexahydrate, magnesium powder, nitric acid, sulfuric acid, hydrogen peroxide,
